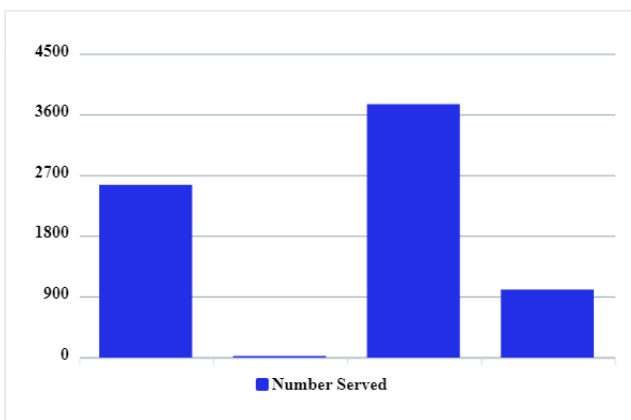

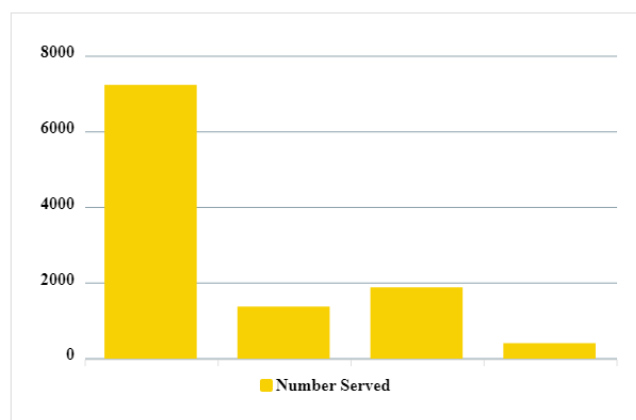

TOTAL HOURS OF CARE PROVIDED IN FY2022

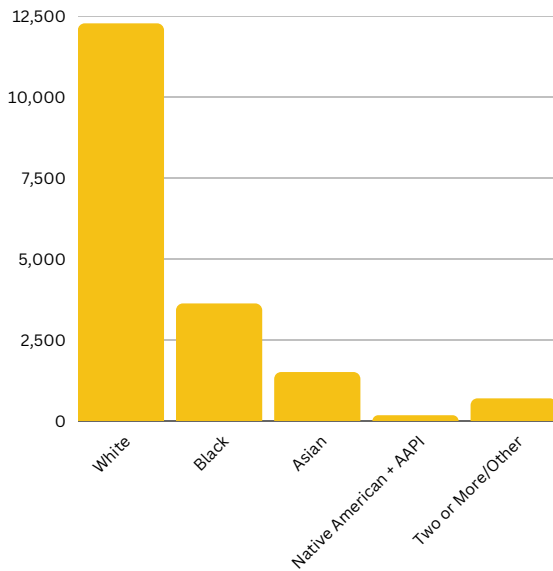

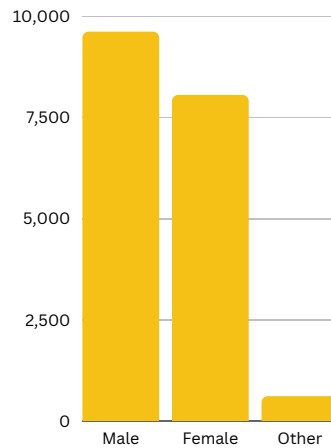

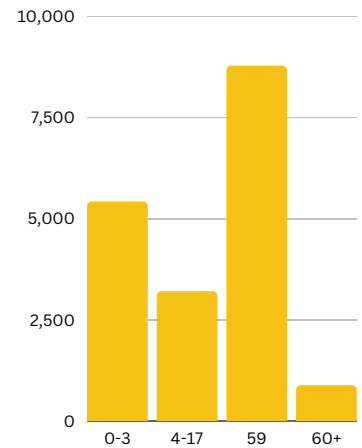

LIFEPATH SYSTEMS' RESPONSE TO OPIOID CRISIS

Texas has seen a significant increase in overdose deaths including opioid-related overdoses, over the past several years. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention published provisional data from 2021 that shows 66 percent of opioid-related deaths in the state involve synthetic opioids, such as fentanyl and fentanyl analogs. Through our evidence based programs, we educate, support, and treat individuals who have abused opioids and other substances.

BINKY PATROL

The Binky Patrol won a statewide award at the annual Texas Council Conference for their contributions to infants and toddlers receiving LifePath Services. The non-profit group handmakes hundreds of blankets each year for those most in need.
